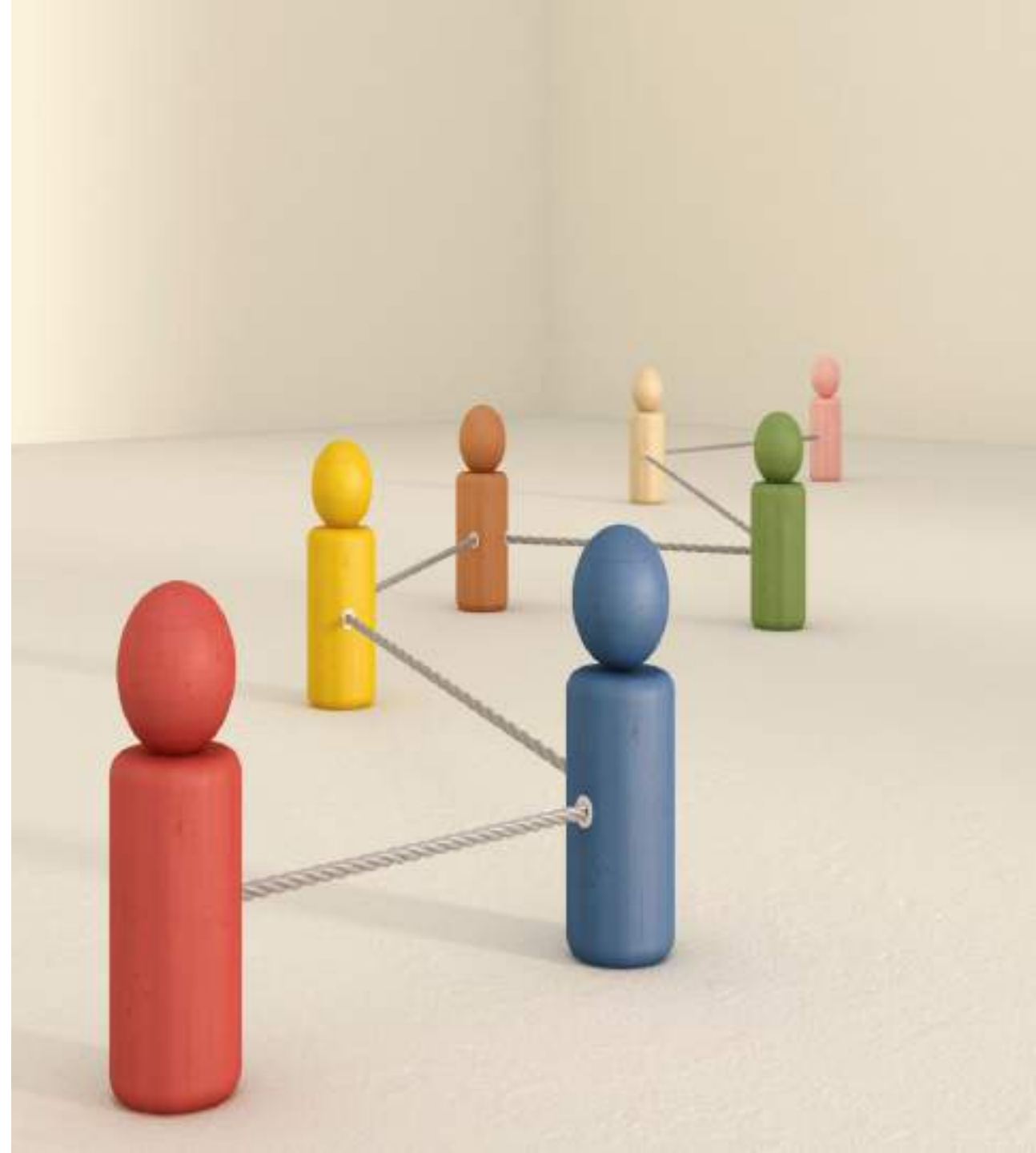

- This differs from partner to partner

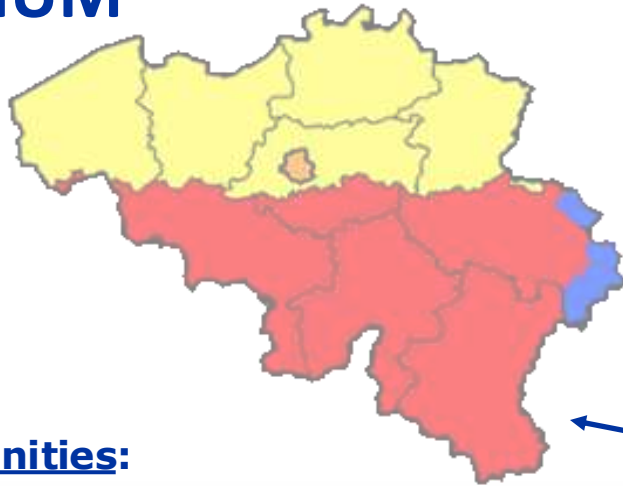

LIVING COSTS

We estimate the living cost for around 1,000 EUR per month.

Please note that upon arrival you will have extra installation costs (e.g., warranty for your accommodation) and costs for study materials.

Medical insurance (mandatory)	€ 12 - € 100	monthly

Other costs: clothes/pleasure/personal hygiene	€ 45	monthly
Savings/unexpected expenses	€ 25	monthly

EEA students:

- ▶ no restrictions

Non-EEA students

- ▶ Can work during the period of validity of your residence permit. No work permit required
- ▶ During the academic year, you can work for a maximum of 20 hours per week. No maximum limit applies for work during official holiday periods (i.e. winter, spring or summer holidays)
- ▶ The student job must be compatible with your study, meaning that you can't work when you are supposed to be attending classes or other activities related to your study programme.

LIVING COST

Housing

- Dorms (shared rooms in student dorms) \approx €50 – €100 /month
- Private 1 bedroom apartment \approx €250 – €400/month (outside center)
- For 1 bedroom apartment: around €550 – €600/month (city center)

Food / Groceries

- Basic weekly groceries \approx €60 - €100 for reasonably frugal cooking
- Eating out occasionally \approx €7 - €10; fast-food combo, café drinks, snacks

Daily necessities / utilities

- Utilities (electricity, heating, water, internet) combined \approx €40 - €100 / month depending on apartment size, usage, whether heating is central or individual
- Other (phone, hygiene, books, etc.) €20 - €80 / month depending on how much you go out, whether you buy new materials, etc.

Transportation

- Public transport individual trip \approx € 0.6 / per trip for buses/trams/trolleys in Cluj.
- Student monthly pass** \approx €11 / month for a student subscription with 120 rides (as of Nov 2024)

Total monthly budget estimate

Student dorm + cooking, limited eating out, using public transport \approx €300 - €420 / month

Shared flat in good area, eating out sometimes, nice amenities \approx €500 - €700 / month

Shared flat in central area, big apartment, many extras €700 - €1000 / month

Picnics on wine farms (many offer pre-packed baskets or scenic lawns).

Stellenbosch Museum (also Village Museum, plus other historic buildings) for architectural and cultural history & **Rupert Museum** with the contemporary art and good exhibitions.

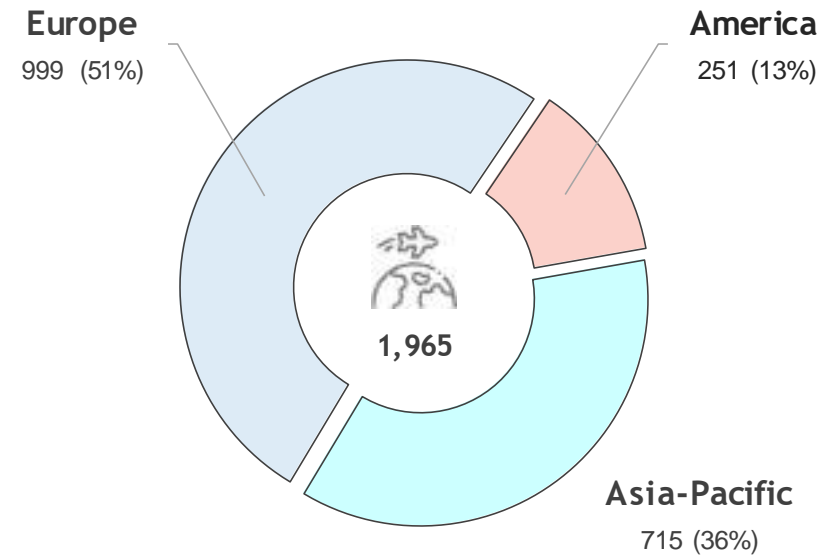

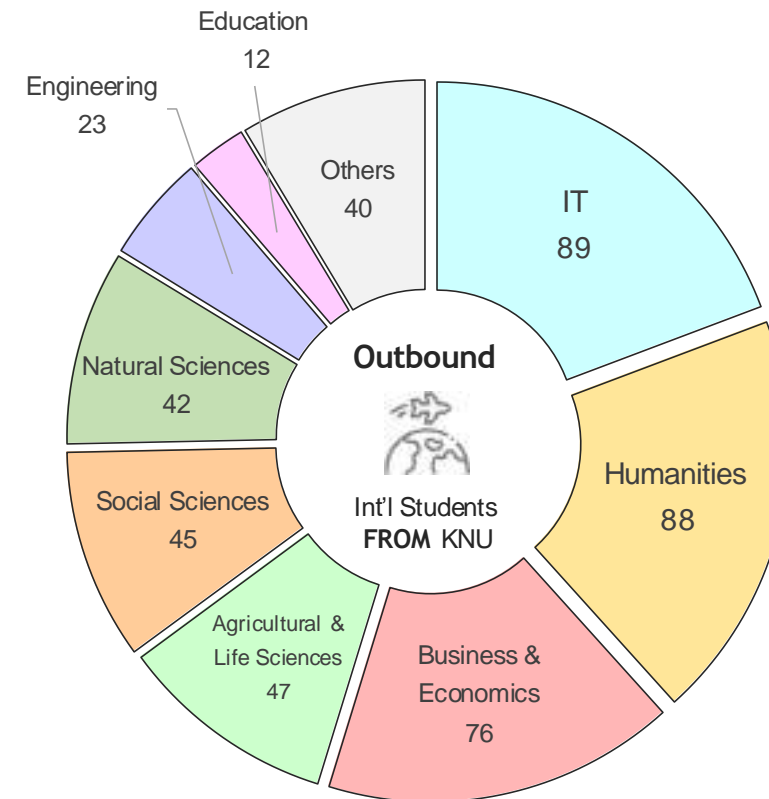
