SBRA acts in Brussels as the Secretariat of global KEN and European development banks' association NEFI

- KEN Knowledge Economy Network (aisbl, completely separate from SBRA). Established in 2011, successor of EREF (European Regional Economic Forum).
- 51 members from 14 countries (completely different members compared to SBRA) – i.e. the Mexican National Council of Science and Technology
- Organized conferences and workshops in Europe, but also in South Africa, Canada, Turkey.
- Information services in form of weekly briefs and monthly bulletin (not just coordination of network, but also provide content)
- NEFI Network of European Financial Institutions for Small and Medium Sized Enterprises. Established in 1999.
- 21 financial institutions, follows information of financial, political and legal developments and measures adopted by the European Institutions in the fields of European economic and financial policies – with focus on SMEs' access to finance






- 70% of all national legislation is decided in Brussels
- Horizon Europe is centralised funding worth 95,5 bn EUR for the period 2021-2027
- For the EU Twins (Green Deal and Digitalisation) really a lot of money available
- About 12.000 different representations in Brussels with more than 50.000 employees

Getting the EU funding for R&I activities is a gradual process that requires:

- Early access to working programmes and information on calls for proposals
- Constant communication with EU institutions
- Regular promotion of R&I activities on EU level
- Networking and matchmaking activities for building project proposals
- Membership and constant presence in different R&I partnership that co-decide EU funding programmes and research policies
- Personal contacts and cooperation with other representatives
- Having someone in Brussels helping you with all of these ctivities above





Green Deal Call Thematic and Horizontal Areas & Timeline





The European Innovation Fund, possibly the world's largest funding programmes for demonstration of innovative low-carbon technologies

Previously known as NER400, this new instrument replaces the old NER300. More than a programme, it is a fund entirely managed by the EC, financed through the EU's own resources, collected via the Emission Trading Scheme (ETS). The Innovation Fund will focus on highly innovative technologies and big flagship projects with European added value that can bring on significant emission reductions. The Fund's budget is estimated at potentially €40bn for the period 2020-2030, depending on how much the ton of CO2 will be valued.

LIFE, the programme for Environment and Climate Action

Do you remember the Rio Earth Summit, the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development held for the first time in 1992? Well, the LIFE programme was launched the same year. The programme provides direct grants to beneficiaries to share best practices, test technologies and speed up the implementation of relevant EU legislation and policies. The programme focuses on EU Environment and climate policies. Priorities are tightly linked with the ongoing political priorities, for 2021-2027 these are: **Nature and Biodiversity**; **Circular Economy** and **Quality of Life**; **Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation**; **Clean Energy Transition**, the latter being the main novelty of the new LIFE programme.

In fact, we can expect some Coordination and Support Actions in the area of renewable energy or energy efficiency dealt within Horizon 2020, or before that in the Intelligent Energy Europe programme (it disappeared at the end of 2013), to be moved to LIFE. LIFE traditionally provides support between 55% to 60% of eligible costs. One important condition to make this transfer of programme possible is the increase of LIFE's funding rate for projects whose costs are usually financed at 100%.

The budget proposed for LIFE is €5.45bn, compared to the €3.5bn allocated in 2014-2020. Although this programme remains limited in size, this represents a significant increase and sends a clear signal in line with the **Green Deal** priorities.
