Delo mladega raziskovalca/mlade raziskovalke na Oddelku za zgodovino Filozofske fakultete v okviru katedre za zgodnji novi vek bo predvsem usmerjeno v raziskovanje v slovenski historiografiji precej zanemarjenih teoretskih vprašanj. Kandidat/ka se bo lotil/a odprtih in protislovnih problemov periodizacije preteklosti. Mladi raziskovalec/mlada raziskovalka bo preučil/a in kritično pretresel/la strukturalna merila za delitev preteklosti in njihovo konceptualizacijo v historiografiji. Posebej so bo osredotočil/a na časovno razmejitev zgodnje modernih evropskih družb od modernih in srednjeveških evropskih družb. Problem, ki se v zadnjem času pojavlja v historiografiji, je pomikanje meja zgodnje modernosti v 14. stoletje. V tej zvezi bo kandidat/ka raziskal/a primernost takega premikanja časovnih meja v pozni srednji vek oziroma smiselnosti rabe pridevniki moderni /novi (vek).

Pričakujemo, da bo svoje razmisleke in ugotovitve v času zaposlitve kot MR predstavil/a v eni ali dveh znanstvenih razpravah in na vsaj eni znanstveni konferenci. Predvsem pa predvidevamo in pričakujemo, da bo v tem času ubranil/a svojo doktorsko disertacijo.

Predvidevamo tudi njegovo/njeno sodelovanje v pedagoškem procesu. Pri predmetu Izbrana poglavja zgodnjega novega veka bo študentom in študentkam magistrskega študija zgodovine predstavil/a svoje ugotovitve v zvezi s periodizacijo zgodnjega novega veka in metodološke probleme, ki jih pri raziskovanju srečuje in rešuje. Pri predmetu Struktura in razvoj zgodovinske znanosti na dodiplomskem študiju pa bo študente seznanil/a s konceptom periodizacije v zgodovinopisju.

Pričakujemo, da je kandidat/ka že objavil vsaj eno znanstveno razpravo s področja zgodnjega novega veka, zlasti s področja periodizacije.

The Department of History of the Faculty of Arts is seeking a young researcher with a focus on

the Early Modern Period to engage in research work, with an emphasis on theoretical questions that are often overlooked in Slovenian historiography. The successful candidate will tackle open and often contradictory problems related to the periodization of the past, while examining structural criteria and their conceptualizations used in historiography. The specificity of the Early Modern Period and its time limits will be a particular area of focus, with an examination of recent trends in historiography that propose extending the beginning of early modernity back to the 14th century. The candidate will be expected to determine if this extension is productive, and if so, verify the appropriateness of the adjectives “early” and “modern” for the block of time that begins in the mid-14th century.

It is expected that the young researcher will publish the results of their deliberations and findings in one or two scientific papers, as well as participate in a scientific conference. Furthermore, the candidate is expected to have completed and successfully defended a doctoral thesis during their tenure. Participation in the teaching process is also required. In the course “Selected Topics in the History of the Early Modern Period,” the candidate will present methodological and conceptual problems related to periodization to master's degree students, as well as their findings. In the course “Structure and Development of Historical Science,” attended by graduate students, the candidate will present fundamental concepts of periodization in history.

Additionally, the ideal candidate will have already published at least one scientific publication in the field of periodization.
