In 2011, you can build a global network by making many friends from Australia, Austria, Canada, China, Czech, Finland, Germany, Italy, The Netherlands, Portugal, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, The UK, The USA, and more.

• Chance to Explore China or Japan!

A 4-day field trip to Beijing in China or Osaka & Kyoto in Japan will give you a better understanding on East Asia.

Various Field Trips and Extracurricular Activities

To learn about Korea's past, present and future, you can experience various kinds of activities while visiting famous places in Korea such as Changdeok Palace (UNESCO World Heritage), Seoul Fortress, Icheon (Porcelain & Pottery), The War Memorial, NANTA & JUMP Show, and more.  - (2) Official transcript (in English)
 - (3) Three passport-size photos
 - (4) Copy of overseas health insurance certificate (in English)
 - (5) Copy of passport
- All the application documents should arrive at the UOS via the international office of applicant's home university with a nomination letter attached when you are applying as an exchange student.

- The UOS will reimburse exchange students for 50% of the 4-day field trip fees on arrival.
- The lowest fees for the 4-day field trip to Japan and China are 1,100,000 Won and 700,000 Won for each. When exchange rates go up higher than the ranges shown above, the fees will change accordingly. The exchange rate of June 1st, 2011 will be applied to the final amount stated in the invoice.
- The airfare will be partially reimbursed for exchange students.
