Usposabljanje mladega raziskovalca ali raziskovalke (MR) bo potekalo v okviru PS Analiza dela, izobraževanja in zaposlovanja (P5-0193), ki ga sestavlja interdisciplinarna skupina sociologov, komunikologov in politologov. Ena od usmeritev raziskovalne skupine je analiza sistemskih transformacij povezanih s prehodom v postfordizem in ideološkimi reorientacijami po padcu berlinskega zidu, ki so vodile v depolitizacijo in rekonfiguracijo političnih razmerij. Posebna pozornost je v tem delu namenjena krizi predstavnštva (i.e. krizi strank in sindikatov), krizi (objektivnim omejitvam) hegemonске ekonomske paradigme, na drugi strani pa pojavu novih političnih subjektov in novih oblik kolektivne akcije.

PS se torej ukvarja tudi z raziskovanjem širših in daljnosežnejših globalnih izzivov, ki spreminjajo posameznika, družbo, naše odnose in načine organiziranja, pa tudi temelje demokratičnega političnega procesa. Vse to od nas terja vnovičen in temeljit premislek o tem, kako vzpostaviti povsem nov odnos med življenjem in delom, ustvarjanjem in potrošnjo, in nenazadnje individualnim in skupnostnim. Tudi projekt MR se bo ukvarjal z raziskovanjem novih načel političnega, ekonomskega in družbenega organiziranja, saj bo v osnovi sledil nedokončanemu projektu Davida R. Graeberja (1961–2020), ki v analizo *alternativ* in *možnosti* uvaja nova središčna koncepta: *skrb* in *dialog*. Projekt MR bo tako usmerjen v poglobljeno analizo skrbi kot nove politične in ekonomske paradigme. V drugem delu se bom projekt MR osredotočal na dialog, ki je bil za Graeberja vedno primarna (znanstvena) metoda, ne le v smislu terenskega dela, temveč tudi v kontekstu kolektivnega ali dialoškega generiranja idej. Po drugi strani pa je dialog samo jedro njegove nove politike kot kolektivnega poskusa uskladitve različnih perspektiv v delovanju.

Projekt MR leži na presečišču politologije, sociologije, antropologije, filozofije in ekonomije, zato bo nujno povezoval (disciplinarno) ločene teoretske in metodološke registre. Poglobljeno

poznavanje in zmožnost povezovanja teh pristopov se smatra kot prednost. Kandidat mora izpolnjevati pogoje za vpis na doktorski program Humanistika in družboslovje. Znanje angleškega jezika je obvezno.

Znanstveno raziskovalno delo bo zajemalo:

- uspešno in pravočasno opravljanje študijskih obveznosti na doktorskem študijskem programu Humanistika in družboslovje;
- sodelovanje s člani/-cami PS in vključevanje v mednarodno sodelovanje PS;
- pregled in primerjalno analizo domače in tuje literature na raziskovalnem področju;
- teoretsko in empirično delo za opisano področje;
- pisanje in objavljane člankov (samostojno ter v soavtorstvu) v mednarodno priznanih znanstvenih revijah;
- aktivna udeležba na mednarodnih znanstvenih konferencah in strokovnih posvetih;
- aktivno sodelovanje na sestankih mednarodnih projektnih skupin, v katerih sodelujejo člani/-ce PS;
- občasno sodelovanje v pedagoškem procesu.

The training of a Young Researcher (YR) will take place within the framework of the Work, Education, and Employment Analyses Research Programme (P5-0193), which brings together an interdisciplinary group of scholars from the fields of sociology, communication studies, and political science. One of the foci of the research group is the analysis of systemic transformations related to the transition to post-Fordism and ideological reorientations after the fall of the Berlin Wall and how these led to the depoliticization of politics and thus to the reconfiguration of political relations. In this context, the Research Programme examines the crisis of (interest and political) representation (i.e., the crisis of political parties and unions), the crisis (objective limits) of the hegemonic economic paradigm, and, on the other hand, the emergence of new political entities and new forms of collective action. Research Programme therefore explores broad and far-reaching global challenges that are redefining individuals, society, our relationships and forms of organisation, and the very foundations of the democratic political process. All of this is forcing us to reimagine relationship between life and work, creation and consumption, and last but not least, individual and communal.

The training of YR will also address new principles of political, economic and social organisation as it will follow the unfinished project of David R. Graeber (1961–2020) who introduced *care* and *dialogue* as key concepts in the analysis of alternatives. The YR training will focus on exploring care as a new political and economic paradigm. The YR project will address Graeber's simple yet infinitely complex question: Why not use the idea of care and freedom as a paradigm for our new economy, which should after all only be a way of caring for each other? In the second part, the YR project will focus on dialogue, which has always been Graeber's primary (scientific) method, not only in terms of fieldwork, but also in the context of the collective or dialogic emergence of ideas. On the other hand, dialogue is at the core of his politics as a collective attempt to reconcile unconsummable perspectives in a situation of action.

The YR project lies at the intersection of political science, sociology, anthropology, and economics, so it necessarily combines (disciplinarily) separate theoretical and methodological registers. In-depth knowledge and the ability to integrate these approaches is considered an advantage. The candidate must meet the conditions for enrolment in the doctoral program Humanities and social sciences. Proficiency in English is required.

The YR training will include:

- the successful completion of study obligations of the doctoral program Humanities and social sciences;
- collaboration with members of the Research Programme and participation in the international collaboration of the Research Programme;
- state of the art (review and comparative analysis of literature) in the research field;
- theoretical and empirical work;
- writing and publishing articles (independently and in co-authorship) in international scientific journals;
- active participation at international scientific conferences and in expert consultations;
- active participation in meetings of international project teams involving members of the Research Programme participate;
- occasional teaching assistance.
